# COAL YARD BLAZE

Flames\_Break Out at Intervals in Ninth Street Pockets From Berks to Norris

EMBERS MENACE HOUSES

A spectacular fire at the yard of the George B. Newton Conl Company. which extended an entire block, from Berks to Norris street, on the Philadelphia and Reading Ratiway, endangered many homes in the neighborhood this morning. The blaze was discovered at 2 o'clock.

Constant showers of sparks which rained on the roofs of small homes for several blocks kept the firemen on the ump. These flying embers, fanned by northeasterly breeze, were scattered in all directions. Four alarms were turned in.

Four freight cars, two of which were loaded with mustard, were destroyed by the flames.

The dense smoke, mingled with fumes of mustard and gases, made the fight The five is believed to have been caused by sparks from a locomotive which were blown to the shed of one of the coal pockets. Although these pockets are lined with concrete and every precaution against fire is made, the flames epread quickly. The pockets are on a level with the railway.
