JEFFERSON HELD FOR ATTACK ON GIRL

Man With Unsavory Police Record Accused by Hog Island Phone Operator

LODGED IN MEDIA JAIL

Granville B. Jefferson, nephew of Congressman McClellan, who has figured in the criminal records of the city on several occasions, is in the Media jail charged with attempting to attack Miss Catherine J. O'Hara, twenty-two years old, 8025 Summer street, this city.

Jefferson was employed at Hog Island, where Miss O'Hara is in charge of the telephone exchange.

For some time, she said, Jefferson has been trying to force his attentions on her. She ignored him and this only seemed to increase his determination to win her favor.

On Sunday afternoon Jefferson, she said, forced his way into the building where she is employed and tried to embrace her.

Miss O'Hara forced Jefferson out after a struggle and summoned Chief McLaughlin of the Hog Island guards.

Jefferson was arrested and taken to the city police house, where he was held in a cell.

Jefferson's military record is not better than his civilian one. Some time ago he was dishonorably discharged from the army.

FUMES ON A TRAIN BLIND DR. SPENCER

Assistant Director of Welfare Is Stricken When on His Way to Washington

CONFINED TO A DARK ROOM

Although still confined to a dark room, Dr. J. Blair Spencer, Assistant Director of Welfare, is rapidly regaining his eyesight which he lost Monday as the result of an unusual occurrence when he was riding in a Pullman coach between this city and Washington.

When the train entered the Baltimore tunnel, sulphurous fumes and smoke from the engine flooded the car. Dr. Spencer and his wife, who accompanied him, became suddenly ill.

Shortly after his arrival in Washington, while sitting in a brilliantly lighted room in the home of General John A. Johnston, his father-in-law, he asked Mrs. Spencer, "Who has turned off the lights?" His wife's explanation of dimly told him that he had been stricken with blindness.

Dr. Spencer described his ailment as acute conjunctivitis.

Dr. Spencer has been traveling to Washington daily to treat Mrs. Johnson, who has been dangerously ill. It has been his custom to leave Philadelphia in the afternoon and to return to his duties next morning. He expects to return to Philadelphia a week hence.
