

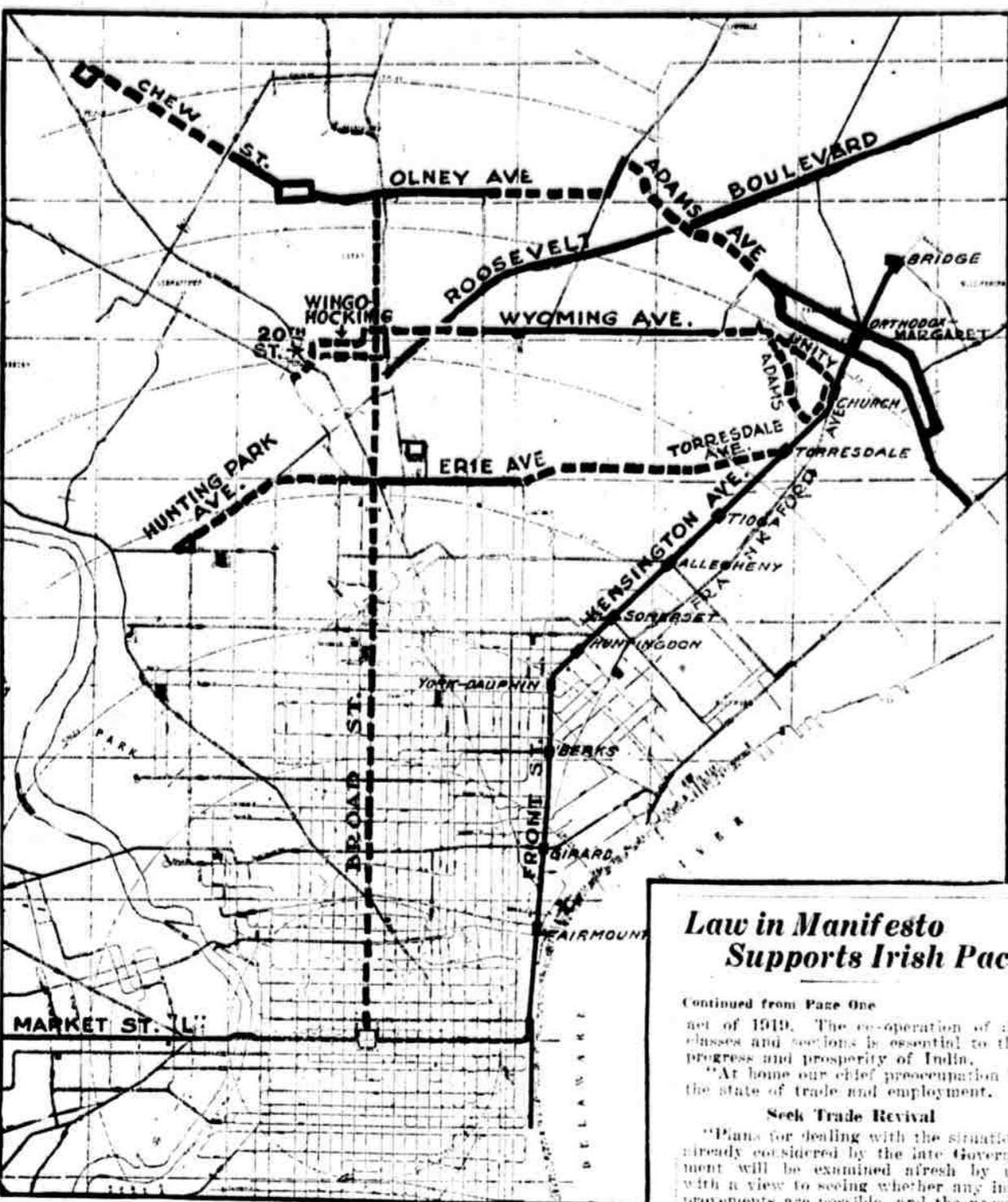
RESIDENTS PLEASED AT TROLLEY PLANS
