Boston Surgical Society Confers Honor on Philadelphian for Contributions to Science

MAYO ONLY OTHER WINNER

The Henry Jacob Bigelow Medal for conspicuous contribution to the advancement of surgery was awarded last night to Dr. William W. Keen, of this city...

Dr. Keen, who began his study of surgery in 1860, spoke on "Sixty Years of Surgery—1862 to 1922." Briefly sketching earlier days of surgery, prior to and during the Civil War, Dr. Keen related conditions and operations within his knowledge when abdominal surgery was first coming into use...

He was president of the American Surgical Association in 1908, American Medical Association, 1909, College of Physicians, Philadelphia, 1910, and president of the American College of Surgeons, 1916, and the American Philosophical Society, 1917 to 1918.

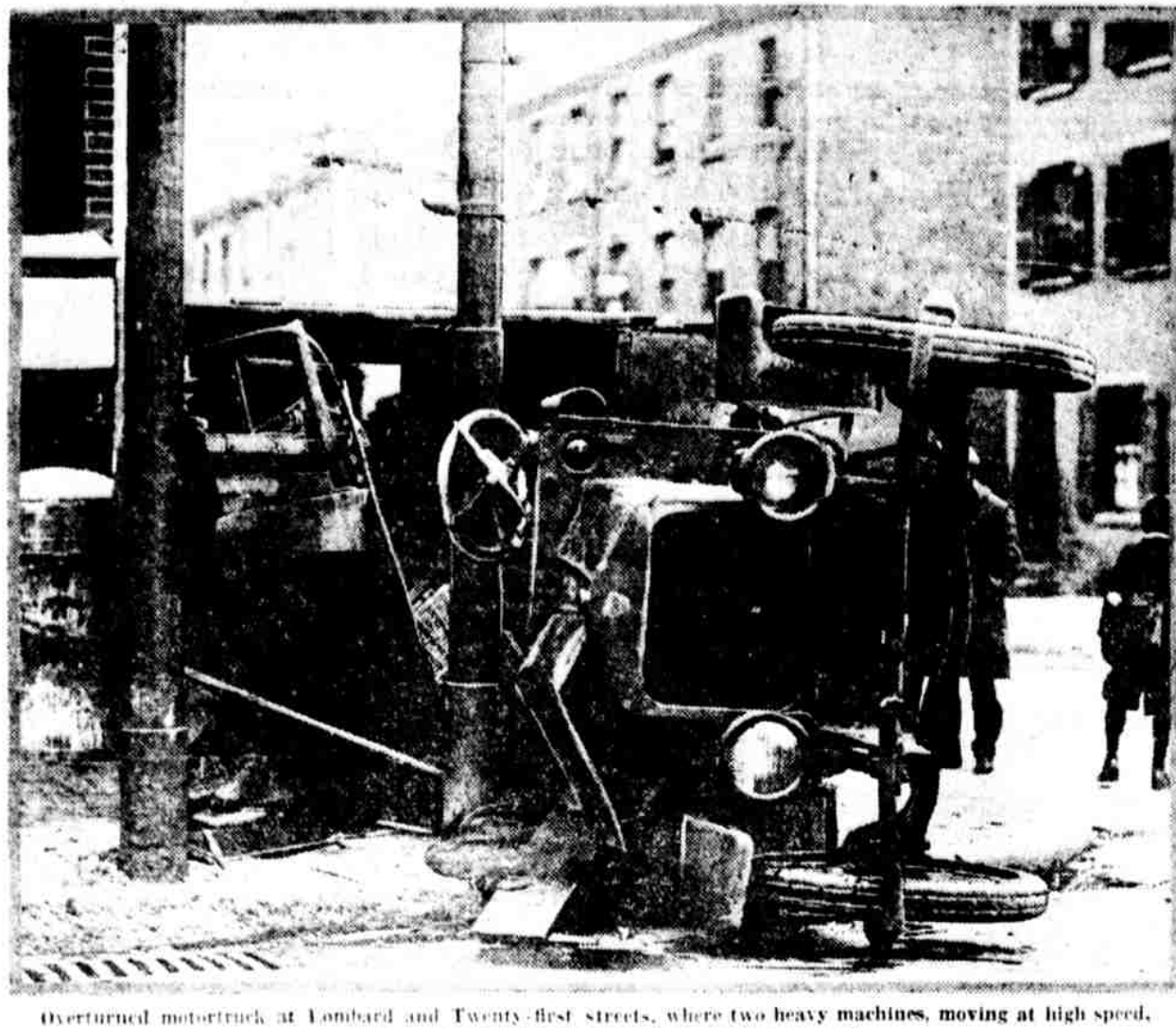
WILL AID CRIPPLES Woman's Club Is Formed to Carry On Charity Work

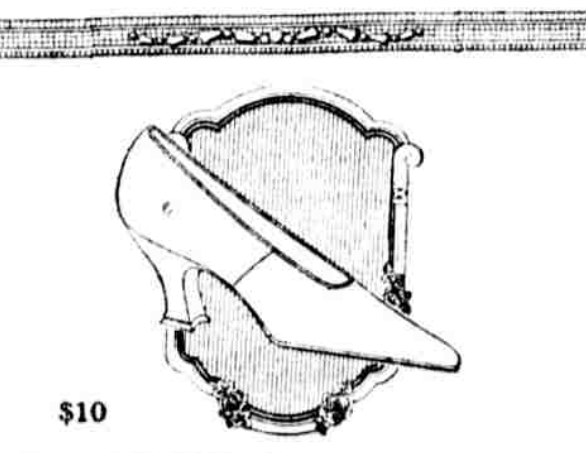
