AGED DIVINE MAY FACE HERESY TRIAL

P. E. Ministers Predict Church Action Against the Rev. Dr. McConnell

BOOK ASTOUNDS CLERGY

Professors of a heresy trial to which the Rev. Samuel D. McConnell will be the defendant, were reiterated by Protestant Episcopal clergymen today as a result of the amazing position Dr. McConnell takes in his book entitled "The Confessions of an Old Priest."

Dr. McConnell, who was formerly pastor of St. Stephen's Church, Third Street above Chestnut, has outwitted the church world by declaring that after a ministry of fifty years he has come to the conclusion that the Bible contains the Christian religion, the duty of deacons and the biblical accounts of his miracles, are not true. In his own words, "that none of these things is true."

Although now in retirement, Dr. McConnell never resigned from the church, and is still subject to its discipline. "I do not see how a trial can be made," said the Rev. Dr. George C. Patten, professor of systematic divinity at the Protestant Episcopal Divinity School. "Much as we hate heresy, I fear that some action will have to be taken by the church in a case like this."

Dr. McConnell's book is a theological treatise. It is a sad thing that a man of his age should put such questions into print as his conclusions after a lifetime spent in the service of the church. He confesses that he is going out in error. Dr. McConnell has taught a number of the first year in publishing his "Confessions of an Old Priest."

Dr. McConnell outlines his reasons for renouncing Christianity as follows: "I have been for fifty years a minister in the Church. I entered the ministry with enthusiasm, believing as I did that the Church was the one organization in the world of divine institution, that it was the origin of Jesus Christ and that He was the unique Son of God. I have been reluctantly led to the conclusion that none of these things is true."
