

HAMMER MURDER HORRORS RECITED

Clara Phillips Calmly Views Pictures of Slain Woman's Mutilated Body

EYEWITNESS TESTIFIES

Los Angeles, Oct. 26.—The finding of the body of Mrs. Albert Meadows and details of its mutilated condition as shown by photographs were not before the jury yesterday as the first testimony of the prosecution in the trial of Mrs. Clara Phillips, hammer slayer and defendant in what is known as the hammer murder case.

Without emotion Mrs. Phillips sat beside her attorney, listening to descriptions of the results of a leading physician ministered to Mrs. Meadows, that showed death and other marks, a faint though quick glance at pictures of the slain woman's body.

Fred A. Tompkins, father of Mrs. Meadows, was the first witness. He told the jury that she was twenty years of age and had been a widow six months prior to her death, July 12, in a sudden voice he identified pictures of the body of Mrs. Meadows taken during the autopsy as he saw her in the morgue. On cross-examination he said she had died since last June.

Mrs. Tompkins told of finding the body of Mrs. Meadows lying on the afternoon of July 12 while sitting on a mountain road at the edge of the city.

Police officers who measured the telephone call of Mrs. Meadows, and the finding of the body with a large blood-stained rock resting on the right shoulder and arm. They described in detail its mutilated condition.

Eugene Caffee, former claims agent friend of the defendant, was expected to take the stand for the State today. Mrs. Caffee, only known witness to the slaying, gave voluntary testimony before the Los Angeles County Grand Jury, which indicted Mrs. Phillips, and she was expected to testify on the witness stand during the cross-examination for an extended period.

Before Mrs. Caffee was sworn, however, it was planned to continue the direct examination of P. L. James, detective sergeant of the Los Angeles police department, who yesterday began a recital of what happened after the police had been notified of the slaying of Mrs. Meadows, lying on a mountain drive in an outlying section of the city.
