

U. S. TO ASK BIDS ON HOG ISLAND SITE

All War Supplies There Are to Be Sold Before 1923, Land Then to Go

BIG AUCTION NEXT WEEK

Quick dispatch is being made of surplus ship and plant material sold by the Government at the Hog Island shipyard. Before the end of the year thousands of tons of steel, ship equipment, building materials, etc., will be in the hands of industrial plants and dealers all over the United States. Shortly after the opening of the new year the Government will invite bids for the 1000 or more acres on which the shipyard lies. There is much speculation concerning bidders. The shipyard site has been inspected and surveyed as a possible shipping terminal, and it is said the Pennsylvania Railroad has displayed interest. Approximately \$15,000,000 will be received by the Government from the sale of surplus material at the yard.

Everything sold has been moved except a portion of 110,000 tons of steel and the equipment on the fifty shipways. This will be taken away early in December, leaving only facilities for handling heavy material and for necessary plant protection and for the protection and use of the big fleet now tied up there.

The last big auction at the shipyard will be held next week, when nearly 1500 tons of material, with an appraised value of \$1,500,000 more than eighteen months ago, will be offered for sale. About \$200,000 is expected to be received for it.

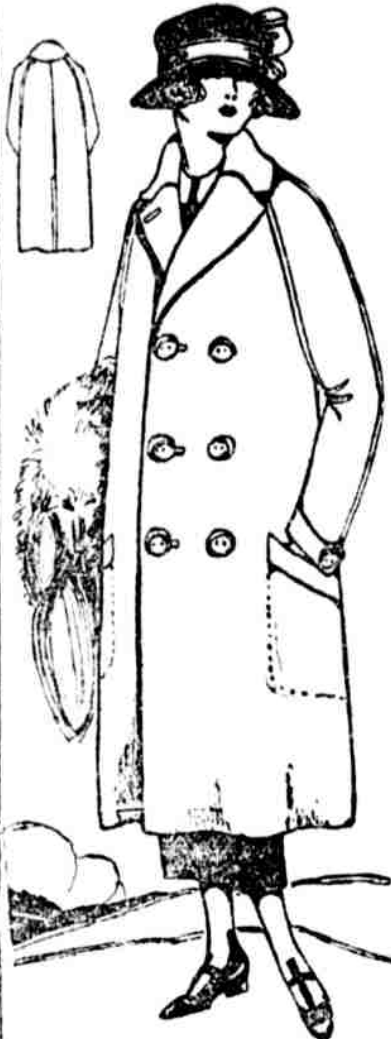
