

FACTA SEEKS JOINT CABINET FOR ITALY

Bonete, Chamber, Fascisti and Nationalist Leaders to Meet King

Rome, Oct. 27.—Benito Mussolini, leader of the Fascisti, is expected to arrive in Rome today, having been called here by Premier Facta, who wishes to discuss the situation with him.

This action has again caused rumors to circulate that the formation of another Facta Cabinet with the participation of the Fascisti is a possibility. All speculations concerning the solution of the crisis agree that it will result in the advent to power of the Fascisti, either alone or with Giolitti, Orlando or Salandra, in case the Facta Cabinet possibility mentioned is dissipated.

King Victor Emmanuel will arrive in Rome tonight. He has expressed a desire to consult tomorrow on the situation with Signora Tittoni and De Nicola, the president, respectively, of the Senate and the Chamber of Deputies, with Benito Mussolini, the leader of the Fascisti, and with Luigi Federzoni, leader of the Nationalist party.

Former Premier Giolitti also will be in Rome tomorrow. In an interview in the Giornale d'Italia, Michele Bianchi, secretary of the Fascisti organization in Rome, declared that if logic, common sense and constitutional customs were to be followed, only Mussolini could be entrusted with the formation of a new cabinet.

The meeting of the Fascisti at Naples and the speech delivered there by Mussolini have caused the present crisis, Signor Bianchi pointed out, and therefore it was Mussolini who had overthrown the cabinet and must form the new administration.

The secretary refused to admit the possibility of any other solution of the crisis, but if for the sake of discussion another course should be contemplated, the Fascisti, he considered, should ask a larger participation in the new cabinet than that mentioned by Mussolini in his speech, when he said he had demanded for the Fascisti the portfolios of foreign affairs, war, navy, labor and public works.

He should also demand the portfolio of the interior, Signor Bianchi thought.

London, Oct. 27.—By A. P.—While the latest news from Rome shows a continuance of a crisis in Italy there is nothing in the advice received today to indicate that anything in the nature of a resolution is in progress.

Some Rome messages predict the crisis will be speedily settled. Meanwhile the report through Paris that the Fascisti were marching on Rome is without any confirmation.

The dominant fact in the situation is that the Fascisti are demanding a share in the Government.
