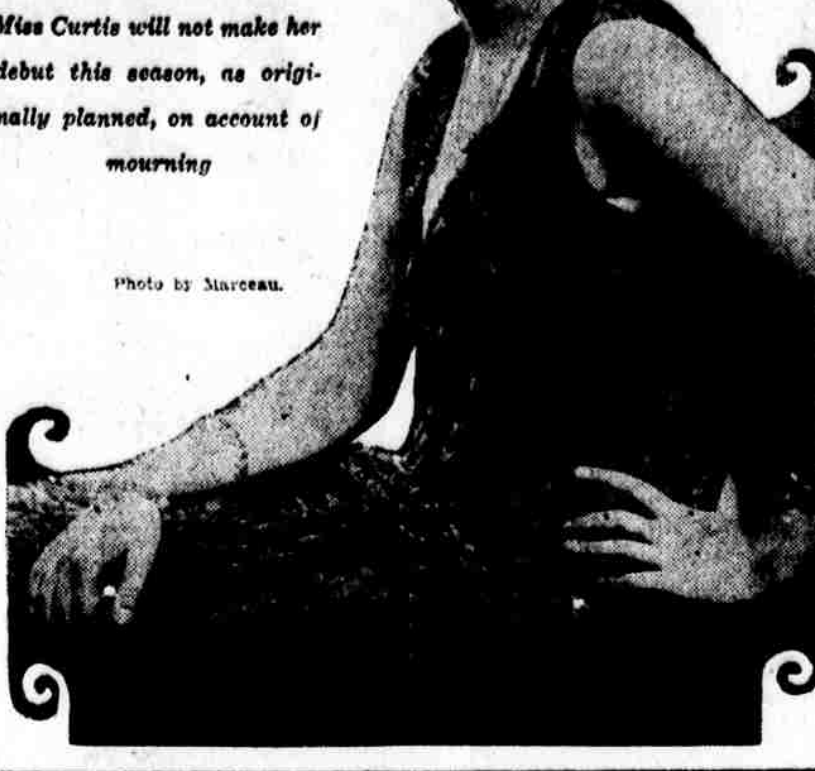
Wynne Talks of the Engagement of Miss Alwina Bohlen and Mr. Riggs, of Baltimore—She Sees a Pretty Topcoat

Daughter of Mrs. Charles Megargue Lewis, of Kennett-side, Wilmington, who spent last winter studying in Paris.

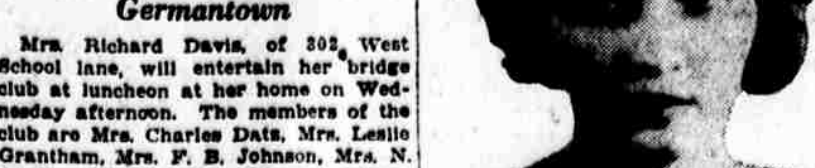


Miss Harriet Hurd Curtis will not make her debut this season, as originally planned, on account of mourning
