Dark Coatrooms Menace Landreth School Pupils
James Forten Building Also in List of Old Antiquated Structures That Are Found Throughout City

The improper disposal of overcoats, hats and other articles for outdoor wear during the day in the public schools is one of the most dangerous conditions that can menace the health of the hundreds of children.
When the coats are piled up in the rear of the classroom they often send out disease germs through the entire class, as well as from garment to garment. This condition is prevalent in many Philadelphia schools.
At the Landreth School there still is in use an old building. It stands in the rear of the new structure at Twenty-third and Federal streets. The building used to be on the corner but in 1880 was moved back to make room for a new structure.
A tiny closet suffices for the children's overcoats. The closet is old. The wool is rotting and the place is neither sanitary nor safe, for it is within easy access of petty thieves.
In addition the toilet facilities of the school are deplorable. To reach them the children must pass along a narrow passageway in the basement of the newer building. The way is lined by furnaces and steam pipes. A slip on the concrete floor and a child would receive a serious burn. This passageway is also used to carry fuel to the furnaces and the concrete is always slippery from coal dust.

At the James Forten School a condition not dissimilar exists at James Forten School, on Sixth street above Lombard street. The building is old and badly lighted. The children place their coats in the hallway, and when the classes are dismissed the open doors completely block the hall.
The hall is easy of access from the street. The door at the end is on Sixth street and is far away from the principal's office, so there is no one who can keep an eye on the belongings of the pupils.
The school was built in 1857 at a cost of \$80,271. It was called the Lombard Street School, then stood about seventy-five feet back from Sixth street. In 1870 an addition of two stories was added to the front at a cost of \$127,820. In 1905 a further addition of an extra story on the front was built at a cost of \$79,712. In 1928 the name was changed to the James Forten School and then in 1929 the old name was restored. In 1871 it was renamed the James Forten School.
Miss Eleanor V. Claffy, the principal, endeavors to make it a success despite the handicap of the old building.

Eyesight is Affected
As Miss Claffy stood talking in the hall of the school it was noticed that the pupils of her eyes were very large. "Yes," she explained in answer to a question about them, "I work so constantly in the darkness of my office that now I can see better in the dark than in the light."
A glimpse into her office proved the statement. In the center of the room a gas bracket hung from the ceiling with four burners. It was equipped with special mantles, but the light was faint. Her assistant has a desk near the window, but it makes little difference, for the nearby houses are so close as to exclude any sunshine that otherwise might by accident wander into the gloomy room.

ADVOCATES HAIKNETS FOR WOMEN IN FACTORIES
Would Help to Prevent Accidents, Declares Federal Official
Use of hairnets for women employed about machinery in factories is recommended by officials of Federal and State Departments of Labor as one means of preventing accidents.
A survey just completed disclosed that "while the number of accidents resulting from the unnetted hair of women is not high, the accidents are of a particularly distressing nature and merit more attention to preventive measures than has been given to them in the past."
Chief Walker, of the Bureau of In-

spections, Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry, said he found numerous accidents were occurring where the hair of female employees was being entangled in moving machinery, or parts of machinery.
Ethelbert Stewart, Commissioner of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor, stated:
"I certainly believe that women working around machinery should have their hair securely confined under hairnets or working caps. While the statistics of accidents resulting from hair being caught in fans or machinery are not impressive as to actual numbers, such accidents, when they do occur, are most painful and usually quite serious."
