

PHILA. MEN HELD IN JERSEY DRY RAID

State Police and Agents Round Up Alleged Liquor Caravan at Burlington

State police, together with Federal Enforcement Officer Charles Carls, last night rounded up an alleged "booze" caravan at Burlington, N. J., consisting of five trucks of what they say is high-quality beer.

Herman N. Sacks, proprietor of the Fairmount Transportation Company, 265 North Twenty-eighth street, Philadelphia, alleged owner of the trucks, and five drivers or three helpers were all arrested and held for a hearing before United States Commissioner Haines at Mount Holly.

After the round-up by the police Sacks, who is said to have been in Philadelphia, was notified and he went to Burlington for the purpose of getting his men out of the trouble, but instead he was placed under arrest.

The trucks, which the police say will be confiscated, are valued at \$15,000, while the beer is said to worth \$5000.

According to the officers the caravan had been making trips through here for the last two or three weeks. Last night the State troopers followed the trucks from Philadelphia to Burlington. The drivers arrested were G. R. Cameron, 385 North Twenty-eighth street; Edward Murphy, 2820 North Twenty-fifth street; William S. Nathan, 845 North Twenty-eighth street; Edward J. Nash, 1313 Cross street; and Patrick J. McMillen, 1506 North Eighth street. The helpers were Harold Bowlin, 2735 Brown street; A. Mendall, 810 North Twenty-eighth street; and Michael Ryan, 1243 Fairmount avenue.

CHAMBER MUSIC SOCIETY HEARS OPENING CONCERT

Rich-Kindler-Hammann Trio Plays Beethoven, Schubert, Tchaikowsky

The Chamber Music Association held its first concert of the present (sixth) season in the Bellevue yesterday afternoon with a large attendance. The Rich-Kindler-Hammann trio gave the program which consisted of the Beethoven trio op. 1, No. 2, the slow movement of the Schubert trio op. 100, and the Tchaikowsky trio op. 50 in A minor.

The Beethoven trio in G is far less known than the two other trios in the same opus number, especially the one in C minor, but it is one of the finest examples of the first period of the great master, the beautiful largo, the cleverly constructed minuet and the polka-like finale, with its strongly contrasted sections making up a very fine work. It was exceptionally well played. The Schubert number is the slow movement

of the second of the two great piano trios which he wrote and is almost in the nature of a sonata march in rhythm and style, although relieved in many places by counter-melodies such as Schubert alone could write. The long solo at the beginning was beautifully played by Mr. Kindler.

BACH CHOIR SINGS FOR THE PHILADELPHIA FORUM

Portions of B Minor Mass and Four Chorales Given at the Academy

The famous Bach Choir of Bethlehem gave a concert at the Academy of Music on Saturday afternoon under the auspices of the Philadelphia Forum, and before an audience that filled the house, besides which several hundreds were unable to get in at all. The choir, under the leadership of Dr. J. Fred Wolfe, was assisted by the Philadelphia Chorus, the Moravian Trombone Choir, Emily Stokes Hagar, soprano; Maybelle Addison, contralto; Nicholas Dony, tenor, and T. Edgar Shields, organist.

A portion of the great mass in B minor and four chorales were sung, the Kyrie and Gloria being the parts selected from the mass. From the first mighty chord of the Kyrie to the closing of the Gloria the audience was held in rapt attention, not only at the majesty of the music and the dignity of the performance, but also at the spirit of devotion which the members of the choir manifested in their work.

the last Bach festival, and Mr. Dony has been the tenor soloist at every festival in Bethlehem since they began, more than twenty years ago. They, with Miss Addison, were all in fine voice and carried out the spirit of the composition in the same manner as the members of the choir. The orchestra was a larger one than it has been the custom to use in Bethlehem, as far as the number of strings is concerned, the other instruments, of course, being those demanded by the score.

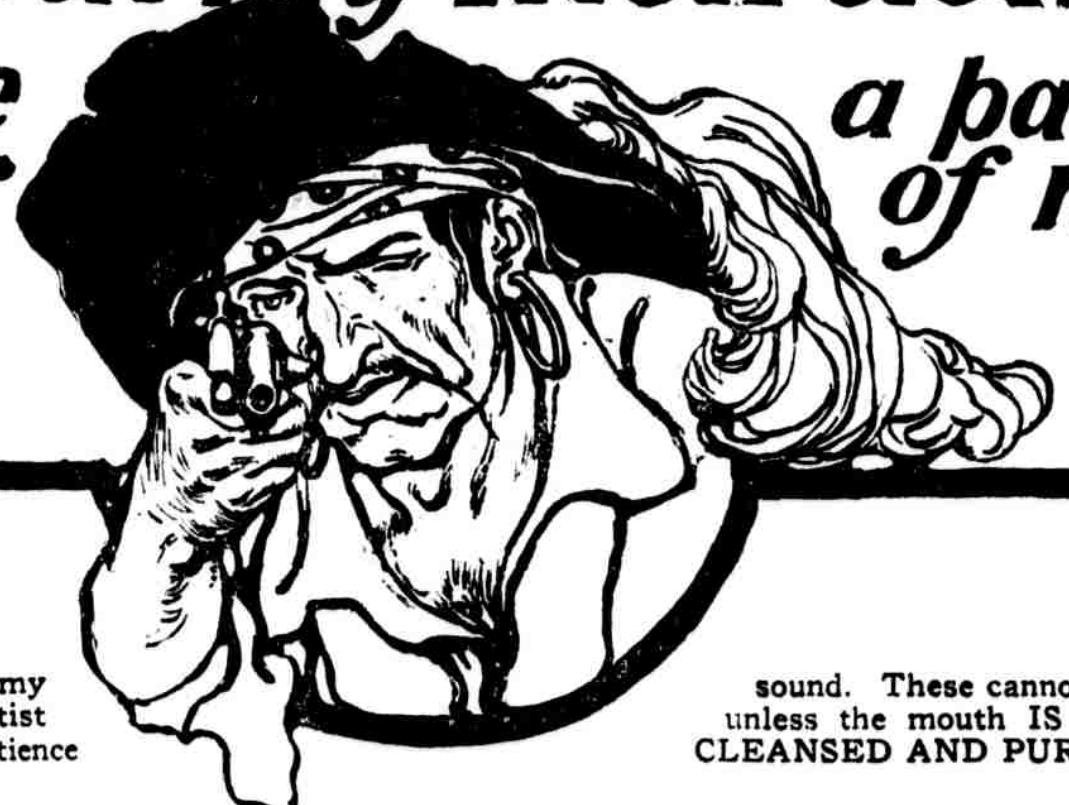
