

# \$100,000 HEIRESS STILL IN ASYLUM

### Guardian Admits Dorothy Gordon Was Sane When Put in Confinement

Boston, Nov. 14.—You have said that Dorothy Gordon was sane when you took her to the asylum. You saw her insane, tied to her bed, two months after you took her there?

The voice of Attorney John F. Sheehan fairly lashed the words of William F. Jardine, the girl's guardian, stamped down flatly in his chair.

"The room was still after Sheehan's voice ceased," Jardine went on, "his lower lip protruded slightly and when he speaks his words seem to slide out over that lip. His upper lip does not move."

"Yes," he said, "his voice not very firm, but a bit defiant as he blinked his eyes behind his spectacles."

### Fought Against Asylum

Attorney Sheehan was asking Jardine about the pathetic little heart secrets of Dorothy Gordon, ward of Jardine, heiress to \$100,000 and now in an asylum, from which Sheehan is fighting to get her out.

"Was it true that Jardine had persuaded her not to marry Ellis Jardine, a young man who has attracted her fancy?"

"Yes," he said, "she had later confided to William F. Jardine that Willard Newell, another young man, was the type of man she wanted to marry."

"And then later poor Dorothy Gordon was whisked away in a cab to the insane asylum by William F. Jardine and his wife, at her own request," he said, "though strangely enough she protested and fought against going, according to Jardine's own story."

### Girl Protests Vehemently

In her room at the asylum, where she has languished for eleven months, the girl declared vehemently yesterday that she was sane, and was being confined against her will.

"My guardian is keeping me here," she told a newspaper reporter. "I am as sane as you are. But there is nothing I can do to get my freedom. You cannot think how helpless I am here."

Attendants of the asylum, relating Miss Gordon's version of her guardian's offer to marry her when she was cured, quote her as saying:

"He said he loved me just as he had loved my mother before me. He visited me and took me in his arms. He kissed me. He posed as my devoted friend."
