

LIGHT HIGHWAY AT OWN EXPENSE

Willow Grove Residents "Chip In" for Score of Street Lamps

RESERVE FUND LEFT

Residents of Willow Grove who live adjacent to the Easton Highway, for a mile north of the junction with Old York road, believe in obtaining essential betterments even if they involve personal expense.

That strip of Easton Highway was poorly lighted. It is traversed by heavy motor traffic. Sidewalks have not been laid at many points, with consequent danger to pedestrians. Rather than await the time when township officials will have available funds for more street lighting, citizens took up the matter themselves.

William E. Cooper, Philadelphia business man, whose suburban home is in the section, made a house-to-house canvass of the property owners and business men, and raised a fund of \$587. Of this amount \$480 has already been paid to a suburban lighting company, twenty street lamps have been installed, the bill paid for twelve months, and a fund of \$107 is left toward payment of the lighting bill for the second year.

Fire, believed to have been caused by a defective fuse, caused damage amounting to \$2000 to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Yates, Bristol road, Ivyland, yesterday. Volunteer firemen from Ivyland, Horseshoe and Hartboro saved almost all the furnishings and damage was confined to the property.

Supervisors of Warwick Township, one of the smaller suburban divisions along the Old York road, are arranging to issue \$20,000 in "road improvement" bonds early in December. Bids have been invited for the issue, and the proceeds will be devoted to highway betterments.

At Horscham, along the Old York road, Mr. and Mrs. Harvey D. Thompson celebrated their twenty-fifth wedding anniversary by entertaining seventy-five guests, principally from Philadelphia and from towns in the northern suburban district.

\$13,000 FOR TAXI HURT

Girl Awarded Damages by Jury in Injury Suit

A verdict of \$13,000 for damages suffered when struck by a yellow cab was awarded Miss Catherine Rizzo, fifteen years old, by a jury before Judge Barratt in Common Pleas No. 2 yesterday.

Miss Rizzo on October 21, 1921, was at the corner of Eighteenth and Morris streets, conversing with another girl, when the taxicab, proceeding at a high rate of speed, swung around the corner, struck a passingrolley car and reversed up on the pavement, striking the two girls.

The plaintiff suffered a fractured collarbone and internal injuries. Miss Blanche Keller, the other girl, with whom the company effected a settlement for \$4000, was hurt less seriously. Mrs. Mary Rizzo, mother of the Rizzo girl, was awarded \$115 for medical expenses.

Defective Fuse Causes Fire

A defective fuse was the cause of a night fire in the home of E. Spencer Miller, a prominent lawyer of this city, 312 South Fifth street, last night. The fire was extinguished by the family before the arrival of the engines. The damage was slight.
