Senatorial Advisers Disagree as to Policy President Should Pursue

WATSON OPPOSES PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, Nov. 19.—President Harding is said to be in doubt over his annual message to Congress, which he will deliver on December 8.

The question is, shall Mr. Harding lay out a program for Congress or not? To lay out a program is to invite a special session next spring but, on the other hand, some of his advisers say that a special session is undesirable in any case.

Not to lay out a program will be to leave the Republican Party open to the charge of putting off for many months the country's annual message.

Senatorial advisers are divided on the question. Senator Watson of Indiana, who is one of the most conservative of the Senate, is opposed to the special session.

The present session is short, and a constitutional limitation on March 4th will be made to allow the appropriation bills and fight over the ship subsidy.

What is the use, it is argued, of preparing a lot of work for it which will be done in the next session?

If a message of this kind is sent in Mr. Watson's opinion, a special session next spring can be avoided and the country will be kept in the rest.

Mr. Watson, in spite of his conservative reputation, is one of the most progressive of the Senate.

Mr. Harding is not yet sure of his advisers' views.
