Higher Bond Prices Expected
Looking ahead to the future, the bond market could appear to have marks of higher prices. This is the opinion of some of the leading experts of the Street, although some skepticism is entertained as to the probability of the market between now and the end of the year.

Rebound in Sterling
The leading exchanges moved more uniformly last week than for some time past, under the influence of a somewhat impressive rise in sterling. That exchange, on Thursday, reached a level that had not been touched since the spring of 1921, following the withdrawal by the British Government in that year of its gold and silver reserves for the year was established, with Norway, Sweden, gold, the Bank of London and others at the highest level.

Brokers' Opinions
Evidence of close attention which the market has paid to both foreign and domestic developments was clearly seen in the copper stocks, which were largely successful in getting their houses in order and the elimination of the disturbing elements which precipitated the recent sharp decline.
