

# FIREMEN LOOK ON AS BUILDING BURNS

Unable to Save Leather Works Near Camden as Water Supply Is Mile Away

## GAS BLAST HELPS FLAMES

Firemen called out by a fire in the Ideal Leather Works, on River road, Pensauken Township, near Camden, early today, stood by and watched the building burn to the ground because there was no water with which to fight the flames.

The nearest fire plug is almost a mile from the building, and the water supply to the boiler room had been disconnected. The building and its contents were destroyed in forty-five minutes. The loss will exceed \$25,000.

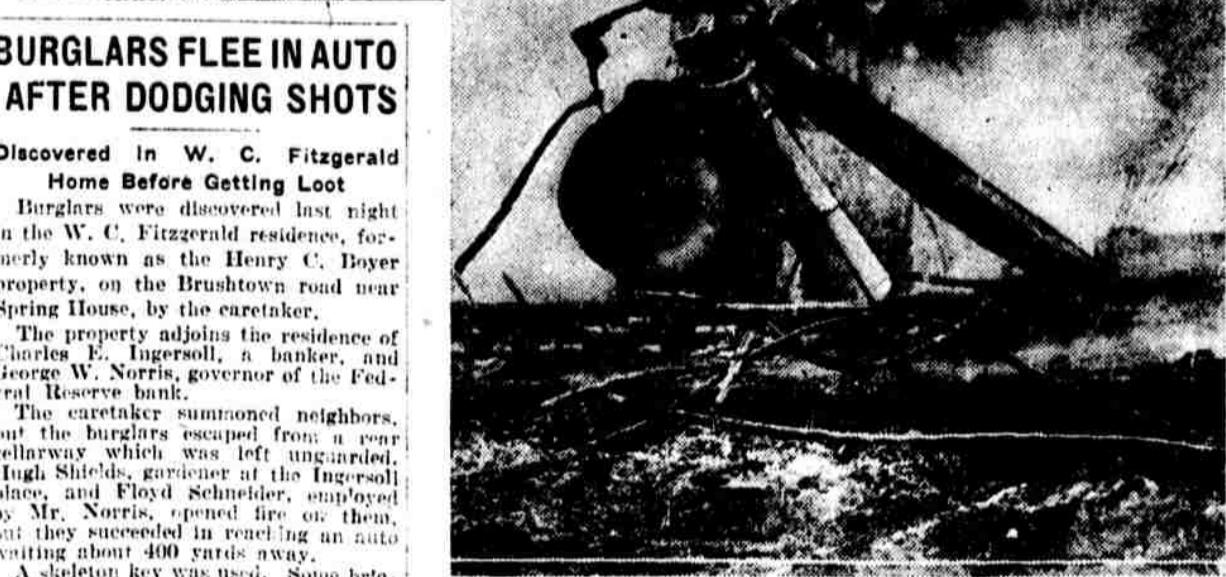
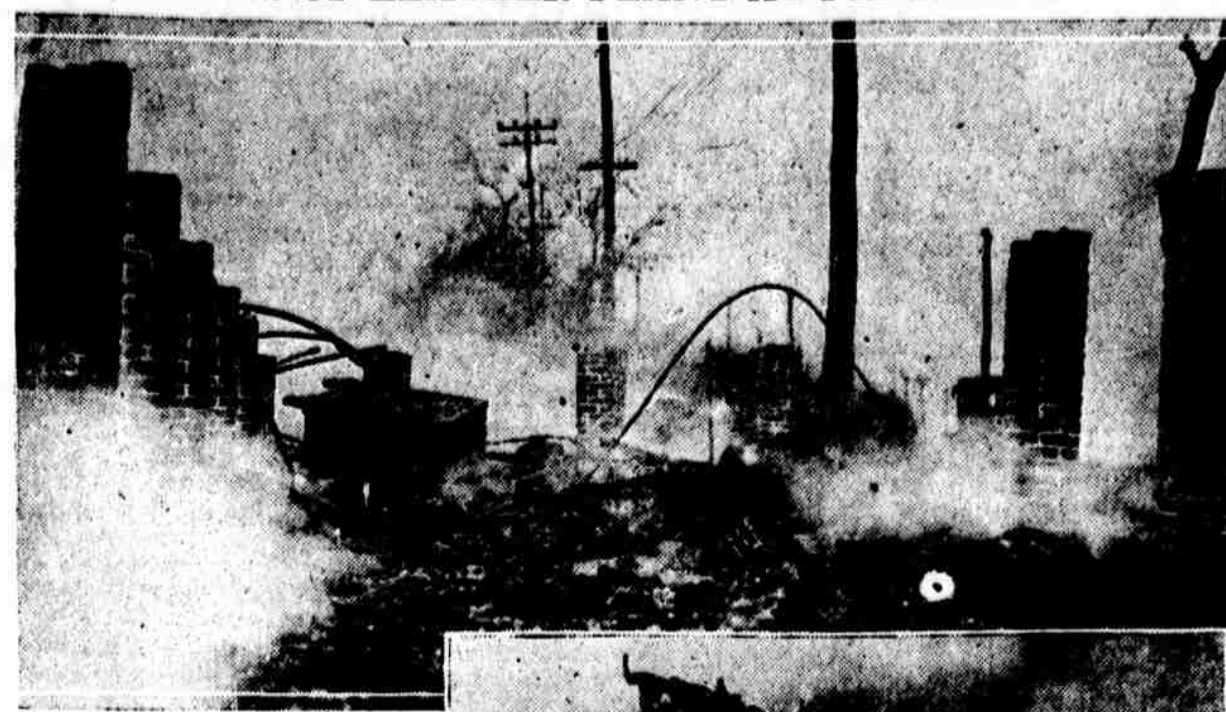

# RUM THIEVES FLEE IN PISTOL BATTLE

Loot Whisky Stock at Quarry Street Garage and Shoot at Patrolman

Liquor thieves, who stole a large quantity of whisky early this morning from a garage on Quarry street below Twentieth, tried to shoot Patrolman Henecke, of the Fifteenth and Vine street station.

The patrolman exchanged shots with the thieves, who were in two machines. He thinks he hit one of them. Hospital and physicians have been notified to watch for and arrest a man applying for treatment for a gunshot wound.

The robbery uncovered what the police believe was a large depot for the handling of contraband liquor. A raiding squad visited the place after the robbery was reported and found a small quantity of whisky in bottles, which the thieves had left behind. The appearance of the place, the police say, gave evidence that a large business was carried on there in liquor.
