Penn Grid Coach Student Speculators Vesper Uprising

THE contract accepted by John W. Heisman, Pennsylvania football coach, two years ago was terminated when the last whistle blew in the Cornell game, and there has been considerable speculation as to the 1923 terms.

It is known that the committee will consider several men who have been mentioned for the position. It is said that two non-graduates are in the running, but it is not likely that the Red and Blue will turn in a tradition that has been respected for decades.

It is foolishly to attempt predictions as to the probable coach, but it is comparatively safe to say that the 1923 mentor will be a Pennsylvania graduate. The names of Lou Young, St. Pauline, Roy Mercer, Lon Jourdan and Jack Keogh have been mentioned with rumors, and many believe Heisman will continue to sit in the saddle.

Mercer is wedded to Swarthmore and it is not likely that he would consider the proposition if it were offered to him. Not only is he connected with the Garnet institution in an athletic way, but he also has his practice in Swarthmore the last an M. D.

Young, Jourdan and Keogh have personalities somewhat similar. They all are fiery, inspiring leaders capable of arousing in the players that spirit for which Pennsylvania is famed.

They all know football and so does Heisman. The former George Tech tutor is one of the greatest students of theory in the game. If he is not retained as head coach it is very likely that he will continue at Pennsylvania in some capacity connected with athletics.

HEISMAN has been at Pennsylvania for three years and his record is not brilliant, but it can be said to credit of Pennsylvania that everything was done to co-operate with him.

Student Speculators of Football Tickets
THE problem of student speculators has troubled the Yale faculty recently and the subject is one of general discussion on the New Haven campus.

The perplexity of the problem was doubled by the fact that among the students charged with speculating football tickets was a member of an intramural team. The most question concerned the eligibility status of the athlete.

The football faculty got around the situation by declaring the athlete ineligible. The student proved his innocence and was reinstated. It is likely that other colleges have been faced with the same problem.

Ticket speculation by undergraduates has become a commonplace sin, and the authorities have been carried on at almost every big college in the country. To the student who is working his way through college the right to tickets for the big game offers a tempting prospect to raise a few dollars, but even these poor undergraduates should be imbued with the kind of a college spirit which would not permit such a procedure.

In the case of the athlete-speculator, it is nothing short of professionalism as the word is regarded by Eastern institutions. Money is obtained through an athletic event and against the traditions and ethics of the institution.

IF we were sitting on a collegiate jury we would rather pass the athlete who has played summer baseball and received money for his services than the athlete who has been guilty of reselling his football tickets for profit. The summer ball player is a professional in the narrow sense of the word, but at least he earns his money.

IF CONDITIONS of the trial were just, Costello and his friends should have been in accord with the decision.
