BRITISH HOSTILE CHURCHES CALLED TO NEW NAVY PACT

'Similar Treaty for Big Ships Remains Bit of Paper' Is Admiralty's View

London, Dec. 15.—The American suggestions that the five big naval Powers reconvene for the purpose of limiting the construction of war craft of 10,000 tons or less fail to get a favorable reception from the London Government.

The same Powers signed a similar treaty pertaining to larger ships; it remains a bit of paper through the failure of two nations to ratify it. So what assurance is there another such attempt will be more effective? That is the Admiralty's view as interpreted to the Public Ledger correspondent yesterday.

It is understood that Great Britain would decline an invitation to such a conference. The tendency here is to doubt that invitations will ever be issued to the nations which have not ratified the limitations gathering arm and working activities. That attitude of opposition may be regarded as a reflection of the general opinion expressed recently in several London journals which raised the question, 'Have we not gone too far toward fulfilling the obligations of the Washington agreement?'
