

### FIVE STONEMEN INJURED BY AUTO

Knocked Down When Skidding Car Swings Into West Phila. Church Procession

### MOTHER, DAUGHTER HURT

Five persons were injured when an automobile, skidding on the wet pavement, plowed into a procession which had just left the Italian Presbyterian Church on Sixty-third street below Callowhill, last night.

There were fifty members of Camden Council of the Stonemen Fellowship in line.

The injured are Theodore Hoegle, 2344 North Reese street; Daniel Smith, sixteen years old, 1087 11th street; Camden; Lucien Smith, father of Daniel, and Mrs. J. H. Robbins, 5223 Larchwood avenue. All received cuts and bruises, and Hoegle is thought to have received a fractured skull.

William Gardner, of Sharon Hill, who was driving slowly at the rear of the procession, placed the injured persons in his car and took them to the West Philadelphia Homeopathic Hospital. The driver of the skidding automobile, Walter E. Gorham, 5714 Wisshickon avenue, was arrested.

Mrs. William Gee and her daughter, Mrs. William Gee, Jr., of 3053 Septon street, were slightly injured last night when an automobile driven by the younger woman's husband collided with an automobile driven by Joseph Ambold, of 6147 North Bouvier street.

### BELIEVE ROBBERY SUSPECT IS "SUNDAY NIGHT THIEF"

German town Police Catch Man Leaving Home With Loot

Police believe a man caught last night leaving the home of Fred B. Carter, 4903 Chew street, is the "Sunday night thief" who has been active in that section for weeks.

The prisoner described himself as Simon Cantor, forty-two years old. He gave an address on Master street, but occupants of the house said they did not know him.

Sergeant McCreight and Patrolmen Stewart and Fields of the German town station, were on look-out for the "Sunday night thief" when they saw a light in the Carter home shortly after 8 P. M. They knew the Carters were away temporarily.

As they investigated, Cantor ran from the house with a bag containing silverware and household articles valued at \$400. Fields fired four shots before Cantor halted. Sergeant Lindell held him without bail for court.
