ARMS PACT BILL PASSED IN HOUSE
Naval Measure Carrying \$325,000,000 Urges Harding to Negotiate With Powers
WOULD LIMIT SMALL CRAFT

Washington, Dec. 19.—The Navy Appropriations Bill carrying a request that the President negotiate with foreign Powers relative to limiting construction of war vessels, passed in the House today. The bill, which carries a total of \$325,000,000, passed up previously as framed by Representative Kelly's committee, and provides for an extended naval force of \$8,000,000, the same as fixed last year.

There was a flurry of talk over the provisions under which the President is asked to negotiate with Great Britain, Japan, France and Italy, but in the end an effort to change the language was dropped in the face of overwhelming opposition to any limitation whatever. An amendment to strike out the section, offered by Representative Linn, Democrat of South Carolina, was defeated 201 to 197. Representative Linnberger, Republican of California, withdrew his amendment. The President is authorized to enter into further negotiations with other Powers as to the limitation of war vessels. Representative Bailey, chairman of the Naval Committee, and Representative Hays, of South Carolina, Democrat, introduced the Linnberger proposal.

Just before the final paragraph was reached the House held for twenty minutes to pay tribute to Chairman Kelley, who retires next March.

London, Dec. 19.—A formal settlement has been reached regarding the German-Polish Silesian frontier, under which much of the disputed Rzesing district, and also the town of Bromboda and other districts become German, while Poland gets some territory near Koenigsbush and elsewhere, says a dispatch to the Times from Oppeln.

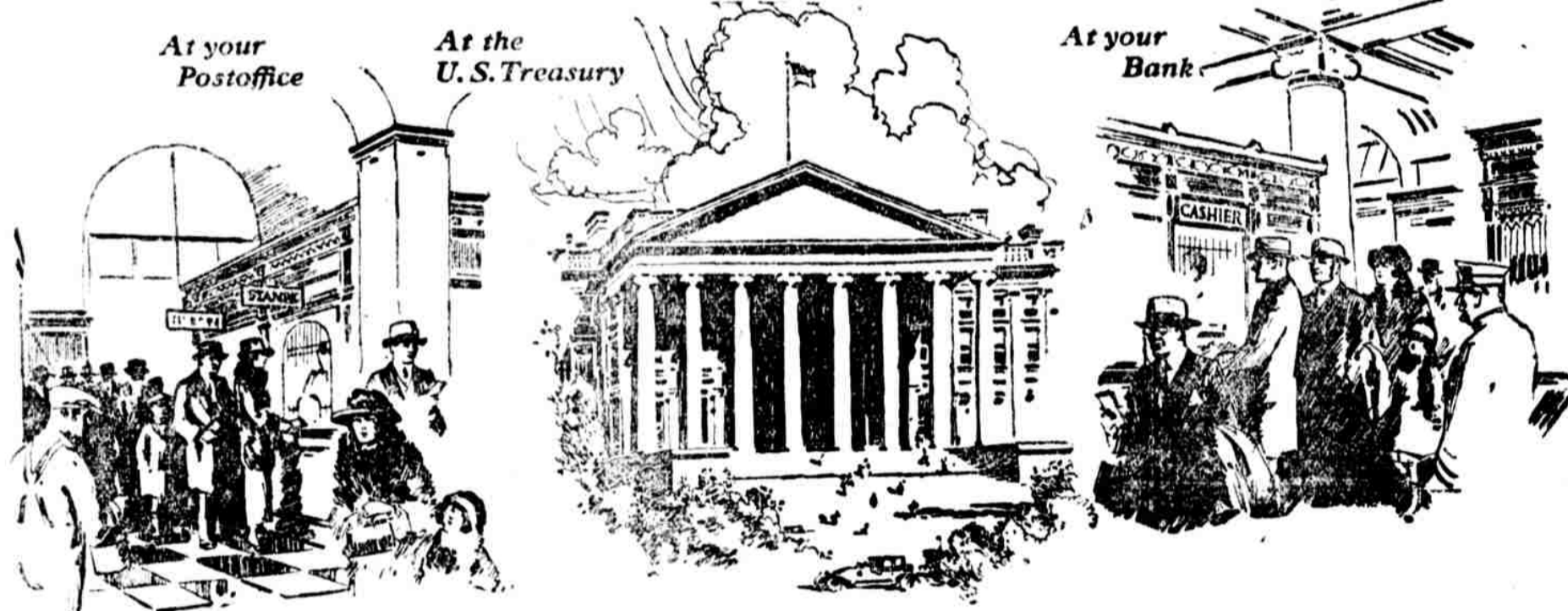
EASTON FACES WINTER WITH EMPTY COALBINS
