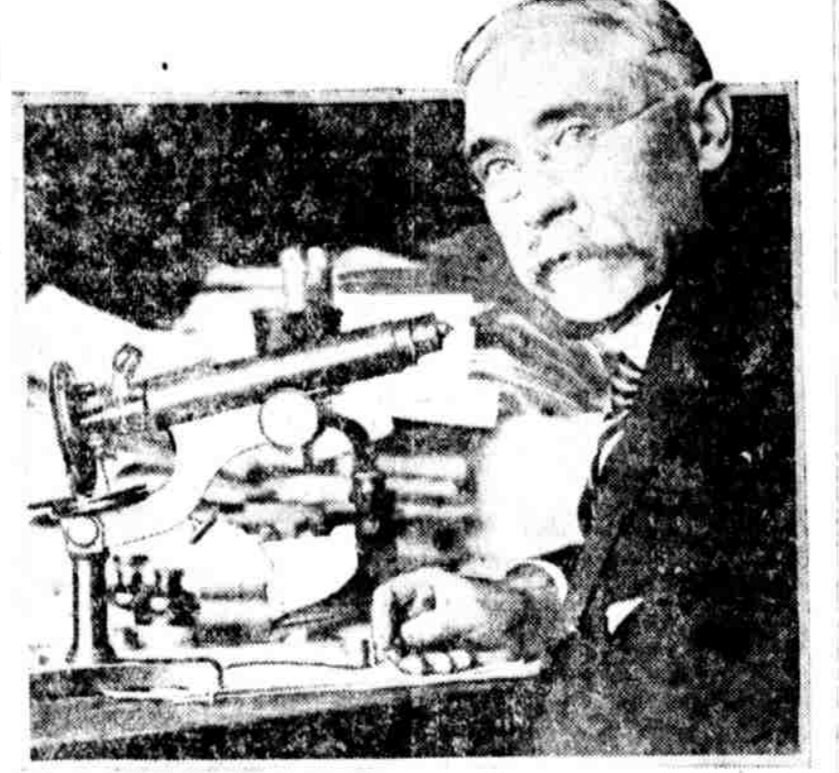
Employees of Defunct Brokerage Firm Receive Welcome News
