

# DR. STOKOWSKI GOING TO EUROPE

Will Make Short Tour as Guest Conductor in France and Rome  
LEAVES CITY JANUARY 2

Leopold Stokowski, conductor of the Philadelphia Orchestra, will sail for Europe January 2, where he will begin a short tour as guest conductor of several of Europe's most famous orchestras.

He will return to Philadelphia in time to conduct the Philadelphia Orchestra concerts in the Academy of Music on February 2 and 3.

In Paris Dr. Stokowski will direct the famous Pasqueloup orchestra on January 13 and 14 in the Theatre des Champs Elysees. Then he will go to Rome and lead the equally famous orchestra of the Accademia di Santa Cecilia in the Augusteo on January 21.

Plans Xmas Festivities Here

Prior to his departure Dr. Stokowski will take part in this city's Christmas festivities, and if his hopes are fulfilled the day will be a memorable one for many persons.

He has arranged together a group of 250 voices to sing Christmas carols under his direction, in five of the historic old squares of the city, and to add to the picturesque scene his trained sixty Boy Scouts, who will carry lanterns hung on tall poles to light the way of the carolers and to act as an escort. The groups of French and Washington and Penna. and the other historic figures who doubtless linger around the scenes of their former activities, will awaken some memories of the familiar strains of "Adeste Fideles," "Silent Night" and "Noel."

For many years, in fact, ever since the first came here, Stokowski has had the idea of receiving this night and custom, which is such a picturesque feature of the Yuletide celebrations of England. In bringing his long-cherished plan to fruition, he has had the co-operation of the members of the Philadelphia Orchestra Society, which will furnish about 150 singers, and Dr. Herbert J. Hill, Stokowski's chief of the local organization, who will furnish about 100 additional singers. The co-operation of the local societies is obtained through Dr. Charles D. Hart, chief of the local organization, and the chief of the directors of the Philadelphia Orchestra.

Singing in Franklin Square

The singing will begin at 7 o'clock on Christmas Eve in Franklin Square. From there the carolers will proceed to Independence Square, then to the Plaza of the Hall, Logan Square, and winding up in Rittenhouse Square. Transportation between the squares will be by motor. There will be three carol songs, the "Adeste Fideles," "Silent Night" and "Noel," which will probably take about fifteen minutes. From ten to fifteen minutes will be spent in conversation in traveling from one square to the other, so the time of singing at each of the squares will probably be judged.
