Orders are taken and deliveries made in the United States Capital, in the Sen ate and House office buildings and in other public structures devoted to the business of governing a nation and en-

forcing its laws.

The drop in price, the beetleggers explain, is due to the augmented sup-plies from many foreign as well as domestic sources. The capital ruin runners depend chiefly upon Philadel-phia, Baltimore and the Balama Islamis for their sources of supply.

Of "agents" who engaged staterooms and traveled with as many as four trunks, each containing from fifteen to thirty cases of liquor.

Arrests will be made soon, the Federal men announced.


