Important from Missouri. FORTSBY, Mo., July 27.—General Sweeney's command, which left Springfield on Saturday last, arrived here to-day, dispersed a band of one hundred and fifty rebels that was stationed at this point and took possession of the town. Five of the rebels were killed and several wounded.

Mr. Wilkey, correspondent of the New York Times, was slightly wounded. The following morning the U. S. troops, under Major Van Horn, took possession of the town, and erected the stars and stripes over their Court House.

It is said that the enemy in the country surrounding Harrisville number from 600 to 1,000. The detachment of two companies of Col. Milligan's regiment and three companies of the Home Guards, sent to Hickory Hill, near Mount Pleasant, in Cole county, was fired on from an ambush near that place, but no one was hit.

Since the withdrawal of the Federal troops from Calloway county, opposite here, the rebels are again concentrating. Trouble is feared from there, and from Harris' forces.

ROLLA, Mo., July 27.—A light took place on Thursday, on Lane's Prairie, fifteen miles from here, between a party of 65 rebels and 15 Home Guards from Rolla.
