The labor of harvesting the fruit crop this season, is unfortunately light in many sections .-The chief cause of the small crop was the heavy frost in the Spring just as the trees came into bloom. There is no preventive for this except planting in a cool backward place, or mulching about the roots to prevent an early growth. 
