TO THE YOUNG MEN OF CENTRE CO.

Having been authorized by the the Governor of Pennsylvania to organize a Company of Volunteers for the three years service we call upon the

All the Pension Laws in force apply to all men in the Volunteer service and every sick or disabled soldier will be comfortably provided for, and those dependent upon them: will be entitled to

The County Relief Fund.

As soon as eighty men are enrolled, they will be taken to camp where their pay will commence and their uniforms be received.

Reply to Seward's Letter.

Gov. Curtin, has addressed to the Secretary of State a communication in reference to the recent circular of that office recommending the fortifying of our sea coast at the expense of the separate States. The Governor says he is glad to learn that there is no prospect of a disturbance of relations with foreign powers, but deems himself unable to see why, such being the case, individual States should be called on to fortify themselves. He further remarks that the Legislature of Pennsylvania will not meet till more than a month after Congress adjourns and that the emergency does not seem sufficiently great to authorize him to call a special session. He next says that he doubts not Congress would vote to reimburse the States for their expenses incurred in accordance with the circular of the Secretary, yet he calls attention to the delay which has marked the payment to Pennsylvania of the money advanced in raising and equipping volunteers, and hints that it would be satisfactory if the Government would be more prompt in settling claims of this character. He suggests, in conclusion, that it would seem proper for the General Government to do its own work directly in regard to fortifications, but promises, if this shall not seem desirable, that Pennsylvania will respond zealously to any demand of the country.
