BY virtue and authority of the powers and duties in me vested by the 11th Section of Act of Assembly of 24th May, 1871, all fish baskets, oed wires, kiddles, brush or fanlike nets or any other permanent net means of taking fish in the nature of a seine which are known to be wasteful and extravagant modes of fishing, existing in any of the streams within Centre county, are hereby declared common nuisances and are ordered to be dismantled by their owners or managers, so as to render them no longer capable of taking or injuring fish of the streams of whatever kind; and if such fish baskets, oed wires, where they now exist, are not destroyed or dismantled within ten days after the date of this notice, I shall proceed to remove and dismantle the same as directed by said 11th Section of Act of 24th May, 1871.
