DOM PEDRO, Emperor of Brazil, has some original and very effective ways of doing things. Wishing to test a railroad brake of which he had heard a great deal, he had the appliance adjusted to his locomotive and cars, and the engi-neer instructed how to use it. At a dangerous point in the road the engineer, whose train was running at thirty two miles an hour, saw what was apparently an im-mense rock that had fallen upon the track a few hundred yards ahead. He put the brakes down with a vigor which may be conceived, and succeeded in ar-resting the train before it came in collision with the obstacle. This, however, when more closely examined, proved to be a pasteboard rock of Dom Pedro's own contrivance. He wanted a practi-cal test of the new brake, and this was his way of securing it.
