EATH OF A DISTINGUISHED CHEMIST AND WRITER UPON SCIENCE AND PHILOSOPHY. Dr. John W. Draper died Wednesday

Dr. John W. Draper died Wednesday norning the 4th instant, at his resisence, at Hastings-on-the-Hudson, at he age of 71 years.

John William Draper was a native of England, but his life was mainly passed in the United States, and he was so thoroughly and prominently identified with the educational, literary and political history of this country for fifty years that he must be classed as an american in every sense of the word. We was born at St. Helens, near Liverpool, May 5, 1811, and was partly educated in the Wesleyan Methodist School at Woodhouse Grove and at the Univer pool, May 5, 1811, and was partly educated in the Wesleyan Methodist School at Woodhouse Grove and at the University of Londay. In 1833 he came to this city and continued his studies in medicine and chemistry at the University of Pennsylvania, took his degree in 1836, and had the honor of having his graduating thesis published by the faculty. He was at once appointed professor in Hampden-Sidney College, Virginia, and in 1839 was called to the chair of chemistry and natural history in the University of New York, in 1841 was appointed professor of chemistry in the medical department of the University and in 1874 was chosen president of both departments. He was a laborious student and a voluminous author on scientific and political subjects. His investigations in physics and chemistry were profound and original and were rewarded by many important discoveries, particularly in the chemistry of light and heat. He took the first photographic portrait ever taken from life, in 1839, and discovered many of the most important facts in relation to spectrum analysis during the next ten years. Among his larger and more important works the "Phisology," "In tellectual Development of Europe" and "History of the American Civil War" are best known and have been widely translated. His monographs on special scientific subjects are very numerous and have been published in the leading scientific journals of the world. Since his retirement from professional duties he has lived with his son Henry, the well known chemist and astronomer, at Hastings on the Hudson.
