If you make garden it pays to enrich the ground liberally.

NEVER apply pure hen droppings or any pure guano directly on seeds or plants; applied pure it will destroy the germ of most plants.

THE matter of large or small seed and cut or uncut potatoes is of less consequence than the character of the seed itself as regards good blood and vigorous health.

Use your richest ground for early cabbage, cauliflower, celery, early beets and asparagus; your warmest ground for tomatoes, sweet potatoes and the vines, and your cleanest rich ground for onions.

Those of our lady readers who have suffered repeated disappointment in the rearing of young turkeys will be interested in the communication of an experienced turkey grower, which we copy from the columns of the Western Rural.

ENSILAGE, and "all that it implies," gets a very black eye at the hands of a condensed milk factory, located at Amenia, N. Y., which refuses to receive milk from cows fed upon the stuff.

soluble and more available for food in a droughty time than the same matters in stable manure. Can Potatoes be Raised Profitably on the Same Soil for a Succession of Years?

THE next day after this question was assigned to me for an answer I commenced to dig my crop of potatoes, a part of which had been planted on the same ground on which I raised my last year's supply.

Plant new fruits cautiously—but plant them! Too much pruning of fruit trees is objectionable. Only one blossom in about forty perfects a sound apple.

More Baldwin apples are sold in Chicago, Prairie Farmer says, than of any other variety. Thomas Meenan says that the average life of the apple tree in Pennsylvania is about fifty years.

Pear trees need very little trimming, except dwarfs, which the general farmer should seldom attempt to raise.

A peach orchard planted and left without attention as is so frequently seen, will hardly last more than ten years.

The Keiffer pear tree has an ornamental appearance, as its foliage is of a bright glossy green, and its growth upright and vigorous.
