**ELECTION PROCLAMATION.**

GOD SAVE THE COMMONWEALTH.

I, Thomas J. Dunkle, High Sheriff of the county of Centre, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid, that an election will be held in the said county of Centre, on

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 13, 1882.

For the purpose of electing one person for Auditor General of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.  
(One person for Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.)  
(Two persons for Associate Judge of the Courts of Centre county.)  
(One person for District Attorney for Centre county.)  
(One person for County Surveyor.)

I also hereby make known and give notice that the places of holding the aforesaid election in the several boroughs and townships within the county of Centre are as follows to-wit:

For the township of Haines, (Western precinct,) at the public house of Henry Hafer, in Armstrongburg.  
For the township of Haines, (Eastern precinct,) at the public school house in Woodward.  
For the township of Halfmoon, at the school house in Starbucktown.

For the township of Taylor, at the house erected for that purpose on the property of Leonard Wertzman.

NOTICE is also hereby given, That every person exercising office of justice of the peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the government of the United States, or of this State, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, subordinate officer or agent who is or shall be employed under the Legislative Executive or Judiciary department of this State, or of the United States, or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress or State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city or Commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising, at the same time, the office of appointment for Judge, Inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no Inspector, Judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be tried for.

At all elections hereafter held under the laws of the Commonwealth, the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock a. m. and closed at 7 o'clock p. m.

TICKETS TO BE VOTED.  
The qualified electors will take notice of the following acts of Assembly, approved the 12th day of March 1882: "An Act relating to the mode of voting at elections in the several counties of this Commonwealth."

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the qualified electors of the several counties of the Commonwealth, as a general township, borough and special election are hereby authorized and required to vote by tickets, printed or written, or partly printed or partly written, severally classified as follows: The ticket shall embrace the names of judges of county courts, and to be labeled "Judiciary"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all State officers to be voted for, and labeled "State"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all township officers voted for, and shall be labeled "Township"; one ticket shall embrace the names of all borough officers voted for, and shall be labeled "Borough"; and each class shall be deposited in separate ballot-boxes.
