**Thanksgiving Proclamation.**  
WASHINGTON, November 7.—President Arthur to day issued the following:  
A PROCLAMATION.  
The season is nigh when it is the yearly wont of this people to observe a day appointed for that purpose by the President as an especial occasion for thanksgiving unto God. Now, therefore, in recognition of this hallowed custom, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States, do hereby designate as such day of general thanks giving Thursday, the 27th day of the present November. And I do recommend that throughout the land the people, ceasing from their accustomed occupations, do then keep holiday at their several places of worship and, with heart and voice pay reverent acknowledgement to the Giver of all good for the countless blessings wherewith he hath visited this nation.  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.  
Done at the city of Washington, this seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.

**Neighboring.**  
—The Lock Haven School Directors have adopted the use of Kellogg's English Literature in the High School.  
—The null works at Lewisburg went into operation last week.  
—McIntyre, Lycoming county, formerly a busy mining town, is nearly deserted, only three families remaining. The entire population has been transferred to Peale, Clearfield county, a new mining town.  
—About twelve million feet of logs yet remain on the banks of the West Branch between Lock Haven and Williamsport, which are being rolled into the river, to be "splashed" down with the aid of a splash dam.  
—The Otzinschson Skating Rink at Lock Haven is now heated by steam.  
—Renovo's Democrats had a Jubilee on Saturday night, which is said to have been quite successful. An excursion train bearing the Cleveland Legion, Seltzer band, and others, left Lock Haven at 6 o'clock returning after the parade.  
—A Swede named Andrew Carlson, who lives at Renovo, made an attack on his wife with a butcher knife, while in a state of intoxication, inflicting a slight wound on the face. Carlston was arrested.  
—Wheat in parts of Lycoming county is looking badly. It has come up very unevenly and has a bad color.  
—It is said that there are forty men in Altoona who want the post office at that place.  
The Milton Economist says Northumberland, Union, Snyder, and Montour counties have been visited recently by an epidemic among hogs. It manifests itself in the form of a stupor, accompanied by a discharge from the nostrils. Several thousand hogs are said to have died from the disease.  
—David McCracken recently shot a black bear weighing three hundred and sixty-seven pounds on Potts Run Clearfield county.  
—A pumpkin weighing 160 pounds was raised by Oliver McConnell, of Armstrong county.  
—The Huntingdon car works are about to resume operation again, after being idle since October 1st, 1883.  
—An exchange says the new railroad from Jersey Shore, Pa. to the Clearfield coal region will be opened to Philipsburg Centre county, next week, a distance of seventy miles. The grading and masonry are completed for thirty miles beyond Philipsburg. At Jersey Shore the new road taps the Reading and the Pine Creek extension of the Vanderbilt system. On the incomplete road there is at present a considerable coal tonnage, which will be largely increased as the road penetrates farther into the Clearfield bituminous coal field.  
In a skating race at Milton on Thursday last, Tommy Stevenson skated five miles in 21½ minutes, beating the best time previously made at that place.
