or plant again a litle later, whien ibs soil and weather are more fivorable.
Ii the first sowing suceed, you are su
much abead; if it fails, you have losed only the sed and your labor. You
can well feffrd to ruun this ri.k. There
are some crops which can be snwn the moment the frost is cut of the soil,
with litue or no orisk.. Among these
we may mention peas, cabbage, cuili. tlower, spinach, onioo, lettuce, eclery,
beet, carrot, parsuip, etc. It is evilim frost. Last year a frot in May d-
stroyed many cabbage plante, but this is a very unusal occurrence. Among
the erops which we would resow with-
out waiting to see if the first sowing will watitng to seape are beets, radistee, cab-
bagee, cauliflower, beans, and sweet
corn.
