Dr. John H. Benton, of Ogdensburg N. Y., a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania in 1848, and Resident Physician at Blockley for three years, was cremated at the Lancaster Crematorium yesterday.

The appraisement of the personal property of the late Henry Singmaster, of Stroudsburg, amounted to \$92,000. The real estate is estimated to be worth \$30,000. Nearly all the money goes to the Lutheran Colleges.

It is rumored that at the end of the present campaign Chairman W. U. Hensel will be married to Congressman Samuel J. Kindall's daughter. It is said that the Chairman met the young lady in Washington a year ago and began paying his attentions. Miss Randall is a handsome and very intelligent young lady, and has for some years been a great social favorite in Philadelphia and at the national capital.—*Lebanon Independent.*

Grey Cloud, McCarthy's Last, Irish Pat, Idle Pat and Guy were the winners on the Washington Park, Chicago course, yesterday.

At Newport, Tenn., yesterday a boiler in the saw mills of M. Winchester exploded, instantly killing two men and seriously wounding several others.

Late reports from the wreck of the steamer Hanoverian state that the passengers have been safely taken off. The cause of the wreck is still unknown.

A Sad Affair.

WASHINGTON, September 2.—The particulars of the sad tragedy on the Potomac last evening by which Mr. John H. Morgan, the only son of Senator Morgan, of Alabama, and Mrs. Emma Della St. Ella, a lady living at No. 2116 G street, lost their lives, are as follows: Mr. Morgan, who is a member of the Washington Canoe club, left the club house about 4 o'clock in the afternoon going in the "Iola," a double canoe, with Mrs. St. Ella, while Mrs. St. Ella's niece, Miss Lulu McCarthy, accompanied them in a single canoe, as she desired to practice paddling. At about 7:15 o'clock, when about a quarter of a mile below the Chain Bridge, the double canoe capsized and both occupants were drowned. Mr. Morgan went down while attempting to save his companion. He was a good swimmer, but of slight physique.

Miss McCarthy, who had turned her canoe down stream and was some distance in advance happened to turn her head and saw the Iola upset. She saw the two occupants in the water and heard Mr. Morgan cry "Lulu!" "Lulu!" "Lulu!" before he sank. She at once turned about, but when she had paddled to the spot both Mr. Morgan and Mrs. St. Ella had disappeared under the water. The canoe, it appears, had struck a sunken rock. Help was summoned but the bodies could not be found. Mrs. St. Ella was a widow, about forty years old, a clerk in the general land office and resided with her sister, Miss McCarthy, at 2116 G street. Mrs. Morgan has been critically ill and she has thus far kept in ignorance of her son's death for fear the shock of the announcement would prove fatal.


