Bills upon the List.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 9.—The Pennsylvania members have a number of important bills to introduce. Most of them are of local interest, but a fair proportion deal with the leading questions are likely to come before congress.

Governor Curtin will also present a bill similar to that introduced by Senator Sewell, of New Jersey, appropriating \$1,000,000 for the purchase of ordnance stores and equipments for the national guard.

Resolved, That we believe the re-enactment of a Local Option Law will enable many election districts in our State to adopt Prohibition, and thereby greatly improve the social, financial and moral condition of their population.
