CROWNING OUTRAGE.

The "Watchman" Office Wrecked by a Republican Mob.

Stones Thrown Through the Windows, to the Jeopardy of Those Within.

W. V. Emery, Gen. Beaver's Partner, one of the Most Active Rioters.

Feidler, Editor of the Coupon "Gazette," Urging the Mob to Violence.

A Howling Mob Takes Possession of the Town While the Great Tattooed Man Exhibits Himself.

THE circumstances in the disgraceful outrage which occurred on Wednesday are as follows: During the early hours of Wednesday morning the Republicans had large posters denouncing the Democratic candidate Black, posted up all over town, and one in front of P. G. Meek's office, and in the windows of the room over the Watchman office, which is occupied by the Republican Kismet Club. To this Mr. Meek took no offense, moreover he allowed certain portions of his building occupied by Republicans to be decorated with flags and bunting, etc. To offset this Mr. Meek for eight days past has had pasted up on his bulletin board in front of his office a large poster headed "Store Orders" with a cut of Beaver and his coupon, words from Powderly, and Beaver's own remarks in regard to the coupons. This bill was torn from the bulletin board by the Republicans, when Mr. Meek immediately posted up on the inside of his window another one, when a drunken individual it is said was offered ten dollars to throw a stone through the window and knock it down. The stone flew the whole length of the building, and came within a few inches of striking Mr. Youngman the local editor on the head. Mr. Meek again posted it upon another pane of glass, when Mr. W. V. Emery Gen. Beaver's partner and one of the principal stockholders in the Bellefonte Iron and Nail Company, deliberately walked up and smashed in the large glass front and kicked Mr. Olle Meek a brother of P. Gray, who was standing in the door of the office, in the stomach, and then ran and concealed himself in the Bush House until the Blaine train departed when he mounted and started for Williamsport. The police and Sheriff made quite a number of arrests among whom was Christ Ery the man who threw the first stone. Dr. Christ a Republican gentleman (?) of Lemont, threw stones and afterward had the impudence to ask Mr. Meek what the bill was. He was speedily ejected.

Feidler the tobacco box, and carpet bag editor of the Gazette Beaver's organ, ran through the crowd telling them to gut the Democratic offices.

If there is a Democrat in Centre county with the heart of a coward, the soul of a chicken, and the gall of a mule, let him stand forth and proclaim himself such by voting for a

single man on the Republican ticket. Let him stand up and defend by his vote the Republican outrage on a Democratic newspaper. General Beaver's Store Order.



Acting Commissioner of Internal Revenue H. C. Rogers has decided that the "trade coupons" issued by the Bellefonte Iron and Nail Company, of which General James A. Beaver the Republican candidate for Governor, is President, are not such notes as are subject to taxation under the United States law, but are notes redeemable in merchandise, and are in fact, store orders, Internal Revenue Collector Staples, of Wilkesbarre, had levied the tax upon the coupons, amounting to \$6000, presuming that the published statements that the coupons were a cash circulating medium were correct. The company appealed from Collector Staples assessment, and in a sworn statement to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue declared that the coupons were only received at the store in settlement of merchandise bought, and were only issued for this purpose in order to avoid separate and detailed charges for each purchase. Upon this statement of fact Acting Commissioner Rogers has notified Collector Staples that the coupons are not subject to tax and that the company is not required to make returns for assessment. The State Supreme Court a short time ago declared that store orders were legal.

THE Republicans have gone over the county and state too for that matter with a fine toothed comb and expect a big vote, but in their scraping around they have waked up hundreds of Democrats who will now get to the polls.

LOOK out for the father of lies. He generally gets around, about election day.

Two Brave Officers.
