Food that may be unpalatable in the raw state may be rendered acceptable to stock when cooked as heat not only renders it more easily digestible by breaking and softening the material, but also by destroying musty odors and eliminating disagreeable matter that could in no other manner. be removed. It is plain, therefore that if, by cooking, certain foods can be utilized that would be rejected if fed uncooked, the gain is almost with out cost, as it saves that which would otherwise be a total loss, and on this one item alone the cost of labor may be profitably borne. When several kinds of food are cooked together it enables the farmer to mix the bulky materials with those more concentrated thus combining not only the various flavors but a greater variety of nutritious matter which will be completely consumed.

Less time is required for bringing the animal into proper condition for the market by the use of cooked food for the reason that it is more easily digested, and if preferred, raw food may also be fed in connection with that which is cooked. On cold winter mornings if cooked food be fed the farmer gains something from the warmth of the mess itself, as every pound of food eaten goes to the supply of heat and waste of the body in proportion to the effects of the cold, the temperature of the atmosphere partially regulating the supply required; the quantity necessary for protection Telephone in the store, and all orders that against cold.

With all the advantages that may be stated it has nevertheless been demonstrated on some farms that the cooking of food is unprofitable, as labor and fuel more than balance the gain from the cooked food, as compared with the raw; but, while it may not; be profitable to cook the food for one cow, or two or three hogs, yet the larger the number of animals the lower the cost will be proportionately, and whether it will pay to feed cooked food depends somewhat on the cost of the food and the sacility of transportation to market.
