Many of our farmers, this year, will have to buy wheat for bread and seed, who heretofore had hundreds of bushels for sale. To such the low prices, no doubt, will not be a calamity.

Work is likely soon to begin on the new Presbyterian church, to be erected in this place. The ground plans, ect., not having been completed by the architect has delayed operations.

We can now gives a fair summing up of the crops in this county. The wheat crop was not half a crop, and one tenth of that was damaged by rains.

Hay crop was large and all put into barns in good condition.

Outs crop is large but some of it damaged by being shocked in the field during the rains; much, however was standsng during the wet spell.

Rye and Barley are fair, but not a great deal of either put out; some of the barley was caught in the rains, after being cut, and was slightly dam-

Corn looks fair, but will not be as full a crop as we are accustomed to have, principally ownig to late planting and cool spring.

Pota oes will be large crop. Apples will not be plenty.


