

SAN FRANCISCO, August 15.—United States Circuit Judge Sawyer issued an order to-day citing Senator Leland Stanford to appear next Wednesday and show cause why he should not be compelled to answer certain questions asked him by the Pacific railroad commission in regard to the expenditure of funds for the purpose of influencing legislation. At the session of the commission to-day the attorney for the Central Pacific informed the commissioners that they were not able to present their case, owing to the demoralized condition of the accounts and papers, but they could find the accounts and papers before October, when the commissioners would conclude their investigation in New York.

COLUMBUS, S. C., Aug. 15.—Will Montgomery, a negro boy, 8 years old, living in Lancaster county, yesterday shot and instantly killed Alice Hury, a colored playmate, aged 12, and seriously injured his sister Lizzie, about the same age, with a shot gun. He claims that it was an accident, but the circumstances point to wilful murder.
