The arrest was made yesterday, and the poliee have already secured a full confession from the prisoner. He confirms be yond doubt the statement that the marderer is young William B. Tascott the son of Colonel J. B. Tascott, the wealthy manofacturer. The morning that Mr. rivell's house was to be robbed he and Tascout went to the house together. Tascott went inside, leaving his comrade on the sidewalk. Tascatt told so afraid that he would be ebarged with the murder iteelf that he refrained form giving information to the police. He made a sworn statement yasterday and satisfied the police that

young Tascott, after leaving his lodg ings the morning of the murder, boarded a train for Oak Park, a suburb on the Cbicago and North western road, where his brother lives. He remained there all day, saying nothing to his brother about the tragedy,
