

MILLIONAIRE SNELL'S MURDER.

An Accomplice Confesses that Tascott Did the Deed.

CHICAGO, February 19.—The man who assisted the murderer of Millionaire Snell by standing watch outside while the residence was being robbed is behind prison bars. The arrest was made yesterday, and the police have already secured a full confession from the prisoner. He confirms beyond doubt the statement that the murderer is young William B. Tascott, the son of Colonel J. B. Tascott, the wealthy manufacturer. The man arrested yesterday made Tascott's acquaintance this winter in the Garden City billiard hall, on West Madison street, and for several weeks they have been together every day.

The morning that Mr. Snell's house was to be robbed he and Tascott went to the house together. Tascott went inside, leaving his comrade on the sidewalk. After the murder was committed Tascott hurried out, grasped his companion by the arm and together they went to Tascott's lodgings, on West Madison street, where they remained several hours. Tascott told all, and the other was so horrified and so afraid that he would be charged with the murder itself that he refrained from giving information to the police. He made a sworn statement yesterday and satisfied the police that he was telling the truth. The police refused to reveal the name of the prisoner.

TASCOTT TO BE INDICTED.

At a conference between Judge Longenecker and Inspector Bonfield it was arranged for the early indictment of W. B. Tascott, the supposed murderer of A. J. Snell. The Grand Jury meets Monday, and it is understood that this will be the first indictment returned, as the police think an indictment would be of some assistance to them in securing Tascott's return should he be apprehended in another State.

A dispatch received from Los Angeles, Cal., announcing the arrest of a man suspected to be Tascott excited much interest in police circles, as it is generally believed that Tascott is on the Pacific slope. He has been there before and knows the country thoroughly.

It was ascertained last evening that young Tascott, after leaving his lodgings the morning of the murder, boarded a train for Oak Park, a suburb on the Chicago and Northwestern road, where his brother lives. He remained there all day, saying nothing to his brother about the tragedy, and disappearing in the evening.

It is quite possible that he boarded the Omaha express at Oak Park, and made his way direct to California. The detectives at headquarters last night were sifting these circumstances and computing the time it would have taken him to reach the Pacific.

Attempted Abduction.

WILLIAMSPORT, Pa., Feb. 18.—Osceola Mills, Clearfield county, has been in a state of intense excitement over an attempted abduction of Gertie Walker, the 14 year-old daughter of R. J. Walker, proprietor of a planing mill at that place. The girl was out playing with companions yesterday afternoon, and on leaving them started for her home alone. Failing to reach home, her parents became alarmed and searching parties were organized and were out all night seeking for her in all directions. In an old abandoned cellar the child's cap was found, together with pieces of rope and other indications that she had been gagged. The search was continued this morning and resulted in finding the lost girl tied in an office in Osceola Mills, where she had been left by her abductors. THE ABDUCTOR OF GERTIE WALKER LODGED IN JAIL.

WILLIAMSPORT, Pa., Feb. 19.—The latest information in regard to the kidnapping of little Gertie Walker, of Osceola Mills, Clearfield county, shows that she was seized by a young man named W. A. Kinsloe and taken to the attic of the Wage Earner's Journal office, whence she escaped while her captor was out by cutting with a pocket-knife the ropes by which she was bound. After the girl had freed herself young Kinsloe fled to the woods, where he was captured and taken to Clearfield jail. No injury had been done to the girl. The offender is 19 years old and is a son of R. A. Kinsloe, editor of the Wage Earner's Journal. His prompt removal to jail probably prevented a lynching.

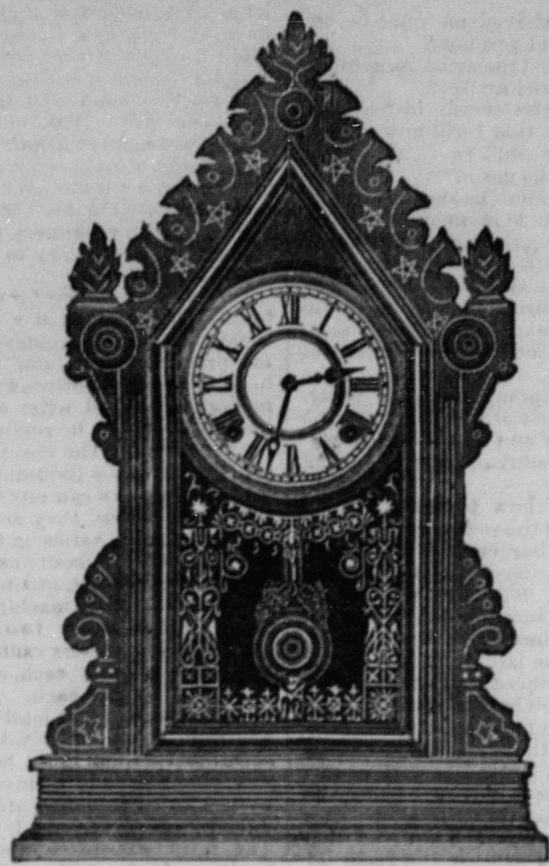
