this plan from its inception, as it will prove a source of profit to the Reading without curtailing its own passenger traffic. President Spencer desired to arrange for through passenger transportation between New York and Chicago, using the Reading and Jersey Central.

The Reading has another important project in view, it being the extension of the elevated road down Willow street to the Delaware river and the establishment of a ferry at that point which will connect with the Philadelphia and Atlantic City Railroad.

The Willow street extension would bring all the suburban towns along the lines of the Reading and the Baltimore and Ohio in direct communication with the sea.

It is probable that the market property at Twelfth and Market streets will be appropriated by law for railroad purposes, unless the market company and the Reading can agree upon terms of purchase.
