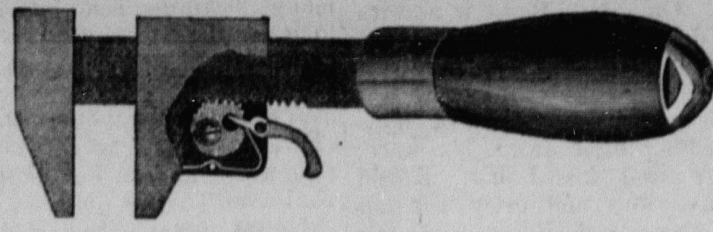

Local Correspondence.

William H. Clark, editor of the Courtland [N. Y.] Standard, read a paper on local correspondence at the annual meeting of the New York Editorial Association at Lake George recently.

Write proper names very plainly. Write on only one side of the sheet. Be brief in statement and sparing in comment.

Write with ink--not with pencil, when it can be avoided.

The most convenient sized page [manuscript] for compositors' use is what is known as 'commercial note.'

When you have nothing to say on any subject, say nothing. Don't string words together for the purpose of filling pages of manuscript.

'Short items and lots of them' was the homely rule given by a country editor to a correspondent, once upon a time, and it is a capital one.

Avoid 'puffs' of this one and that and save the editor the trouble of 'cutting them out' of letter. A puff that he doesn't write himself is an abomination to the editor.

Don't set forth your own opinions on politics, religion, or the questions of the day. These subjects will be discussed by the editor, as far as he cares to have them, in the editorial columns of the paper.

Don't say 'eve' when you mean evening. Tuesday eve is Monday evening, just as Christmas eve is the night before Christmas. Don't say 'pants' when you mean trousers, or 'gents' when you mean gentlemen.

Above all things don't attempt fine writing.

Don't be influenced too much by the advice [which will be freely offered, depend upon that] of people who don't know any more about it than you do, as to what you shall put into your letter. Be sure you are right, then go ahead.

Always send your letter on Monday by the first mail. If anything important occurs after the letter has been mailed, and you can send it in time for that week's issue, send it as a postscript or addendum. Many a good letter has been lost to the world because it reached the editor too late to have it put into type.

Remember it is the privilege of the editor to omit any portion of your letter he may not care to print, that whoever writes what appears, the editor is responsible for it, and has the right to say what may and what may not go into the columns. His view of propriety or expediency is from a standpoint altogether different from yours, and however he may misjudge, he will be pretty likely to assert his prerogative.

The statement of the New York Herald that Mr. Ammidown's woolen mills at Passaic are operated largely by Hungarians who were brought over here on contract is not compatible with Mr. Ammidown's efforts as president of the American Protective Tariff League in behalf of 'American labor.' It is well known that the objection of the woolen manufacturers to a revision of the tariff is solely in the interest of the workmen, and it is not possible that so conspicuous a champion of high wages as the president of the American Protective Tariff League--an association of which the esteemed Thomas H. Dudley is vice president would employ cheap contract labor from Europe.
