### Editorial.



THE PEOPLE'S TRIUMPH.

Grover Cleveland, the man of destiny, the typical American, is our next President. The people have spoken; from ocean to ocean, from gulf to gulf, in one tremendous unanimity. On last Tuesday they called Cleveland to the leadership in the nation. His vindication is magnificent, almost beyond our wildest expectations. Four years ago at the close of a conservative, patriotic and economical administration, Cleveland with a boldness of a leader, with the bravery of a christian statesman, determined to relieve our overburdened industries from their burdens, to strike the shackles from American commerce, and loose the bonds of labor. The whole country groaned under high war taxes. The issue was right, and timid men feared, but Cleveland would be rather right than president. Therefore the famous message was sent to congress, demanding that the necessities of life be free, that the materials entering into our manufacturing industries be free, and that the markets of the world be opened to American produce and enterprise. Dazed and doubting the people hesitated and, while they hesitated, boodle and chicanery elected Harrison in 1888. A fearful awakening met the people, in the McKinley Bill and the proposed Force Bill. In 1890 in no uncertain tones Republicanism was condemned, but its blinded leaders would not listen; so that on Tuesday last, the nation spoke in words of thunder: No one misunderstands. It means a new era of economy, lowered taxes, a ballot free as the air, and an increasing industrial improvement.
