Two Tractor Walkers Ran Down. NORRISTOWN, Pa. Aug. 2.—Amos Evans, aged 70 years, was struck by a locomotive on the Pennsylvania Schuylkill Valley railroad at Conshohocken and instantly killed. He was walking on the track, and being deaf, did not hear the engineer's whistle of warning. Evans was a carpenter, and lived in Conshohocken. Otto Swartz, a German peddler, stepped out of the way of a Philadelphia and Reading coal train above Linfield and was struck by the Williamsport express and hurled half way up an embankment. The man was found moribund and bleeding and hurt internally.

Employers and Employees Come to Terms. PITTSBURGH, Aug. 1.—The striking glass workers at Irwin have accepted the 5 per cent. reduction in their wages and returned to work. In Pittsburgh seven of the Jones & Laughlin mills closed down. A large number of men are idle, with no immediate prospect of work. The machinists who have been making repairs at Oliver's mills went on a strike against an increase of from nine to a ten hour day. The Scottville Rolling Mill company, employing 200 men, have signed the Amalgamated scale. Work will resume in a few days.

Suicide of Colonel Frissham. PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 2.—Colonel William Frissham, 70 years of age, who lived at Tigua and Frankford avenues, committed suicide by shooting himself in the left temple. Death was instantaneous. Colonel Frissham commanded the Fourth cavalry during the war of the rebellion and participated in most of the battles in which the Army of the Potomac engaged. He was the inventor of the patented process of making aluminum. It originally sold for \$5 a pound. By his method the price has been reduced to eighteen cents.

The Reading's Reduced Expenses. PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 1.—The receipts of the Philadelphia and Reading Railroad company for June were \$1,490,780.84; expenses, \$1,044,991.93; earnings, \$445,788.91. The decrease in receipts compared with the same month last year was \$70,823.75; increase in expenses, \$1,128.87; decrease in earnings, \$77,856.66. For six months ended May 31 the receipts were \$8,586,077.00, an increase of \$380,327.75; decrease of expenses for same period, \$778,553.87.

The Wilkesbore Horse Won. PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 2.—A trotting match which has attracted considerable attention among local horsemen was decided at Belmont Park yesterday afternoon. The race was between Charles Broad & Co.'s (Wilkesbore, Pa.) brown gelding John B. and John Hart's bay gelding Sloop No. 2. The former was an odd winner in three straight heats. Best time, 2:24.
