

**Election Proclamation.**

God save the Commonwealth. I, John P. Condo, High Sheriff of the county of Centre, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the county aforesaid that an election will be held in the said county of Centre on the First Tuesday of November, 1894, being the 6th day of November A. D. 1894, for the purpose of electing one person for Governor, one person for Lieutenant Governor, one person for Auditor General, two persons for Secretary of Internal Affairs, two persons for Representatives-at-Large in Congress, one person for Representative in Congress, one person for Senator in the General Assembly,

two persons for Representatives in the General Assembly, one person for Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, one person for Associate Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, one person for Jury Commissioner. I also hereby make known and give notice that the place of holding election in the several wards, boroughs, districts and townships within the county of Centre is as follows: For the North ward of the borough of Bellefonte, at the Hook and Laidler Company's house, on East Howard street. For the South ward of the borough of Bellefonte, at the Court House in Bellefonte. For the West ward of the borough of Bellefonte, in the carriage shops of S. A. McQuiston, in Bellefonte. For the first ward in the borough of Philipsburg, at the house of Adam Moyer, corner of Beaver and Front streets. For the Second ward of the borough of Philipsburg, at the public building at the corner of North Centre and Presqueisle streets. If a Cross (X) be Marked Within the Circle it will be Equivalent to a Mark Opposite Every Name in the Column. Those who do Not Desire to Vote a Straight Ticket Must Not Mark a Cross Within the Circle at the Head of the Column.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That every person, excepting Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States, or of this State or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the Legislative, Executive or Judiciary departments of this State or of the United States, or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every Member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the Select or Common Council of any city, or Commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or Clerk of any Election of this Commonwealth; and that no Inspector, Judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for, except that of an election officer.

At all elections held under the law of this Commonwealth, the polls shall be opened at 7 o'clock A. M., and close at 7 o'clock P. M.
