PENSION NEWS.

A new United States Pension Law has been enacted bearing date March 6th, 1896, which reads as follows:

"That whenever a claim for pension under the act of June 27th, 1890, has been, or shall hereafter be, rejected, suspended, or dismissed, and a new application shall have been, or shall hereafter be, filed, and a pension has been, or shall hereafter be, allowed in such claim, such pensions shall date from time of filing the first application, provided the evidence in the case shall show a pensionable disability to have existed, or to exist, at the time of filing such application, anything in any law or ruling of the Department to the contrary notwithstanding."

This law will be found of interest to every pensioner whose pension was not allowed from the date of the filing of the first application.

I desire to say further that if any ex-soldier, after reading this article, finds this new law fits his case and is desirous of applying for the money which this law allows him after proving his right to it, I will undertake to prosecute the claim with promptness and carefulness.

The application for this "back pay" is made in the same way as for "Increase of Pensions etc." I have a full supply of blanks of this kind and I will take pleasure in mailing them to all desiring to push such claims.

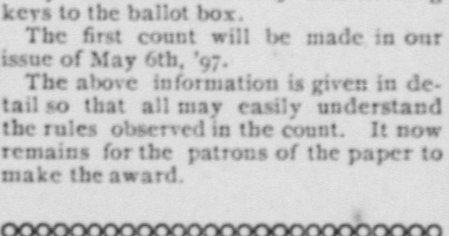
