REPORT OF GRAND JURY.

To the Honorable the Judges of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Centre, August Sessions, 1899:

The Grand Inquest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, inquiring for the County of Centre, in all matters relating to the same, do respectfully report:

That they have acted upon twenty-eight bills of indictment which twenty were found true bills, and eight ignored. One report of bridge at Reynolds' mill approved. We beg leave to report:

That we have visited and inspected county buildings and find the jail in fair condition generally, as also the dwelling part of the same. No repairs about the Court House are necessary at present except that the Prothonotary's office should have put on new paper. We would respectfully recommend that a new desk be placed in the sheriff's office for the use of the sheriff, and that the water closets of the jail be repaired at once, they being the old style iron hopper closets entirely unfit to be used in a sleeping apartment, and are detrimental in the health of the business and should be replaced by new ones of modern style. It is further recommended that the sheriff's stable be lined and repaired.

We respectfully tender our thanks to the Honorable Judge and District Attorney for their courtesy and assistance rendered us during our deliberations.

Severe Storm.

Another heavy rain storm, accompanied by an unusual electric display, passed over this section; about Howard and Beech Creek the storm was very heavy. Lightning filled the air constantly and struck a number of buildings, entailing heavy loss. The barn of Robt. Confer, near Howard, was struck by lightning about 6 o'clock and entirely consumed, together with a large amount of hay, wheat and all the crops. Insurance only \$1200. Two horses and a colt also perished in the flames. The barn of Joseph Hubbard, near Beech Creek, was struck and a steer was killed by the bolt. The house of Charles Heimer, at Beech Creek, was also struck, but the damage was slight. The storm lasted about an hour.

The barn of Jacob Dehass, at Howard, was also struck by lightning and one cow was killed.

The storm was heavier in Nittany and Bald Eagle valleys than it was here and Bald Eagle and Fishing creeks rose several feet during the night.
