#### EXCESSIVE DOG TAX.

Clearly Set Out How Twice Too Much Money is Collected. Used For County Orders.

The following very clearly, fully and explicitly explains to the people how Commissioners Riddle and Flsher imposed on the dog owners, and misappropriated about \$2000 of the sheep fund. The following totals are copied from the different statements:

Total Dog Tax Misappropriated to pay County Orders.... \$ 1984.97 In April 1899 the dog tax was again assessed at the same excessive high rate. These commissioners saw that they were levying more than was needed, even in the face of the fact that they had over \$3000 still uncollected and the sheep claims have been growing less, from year to year. The law says they shall levy ONLY A SUFFICIENT amount to pay the sheep claims.

Dog owners can easily see where they have been imposed upon, by Commis sioners Riddle and Fisher, and are compelled to pay about twice as much for the privilege of keeping a dog as the law intends they should.
