Ed Craft, of Burnside township, killed a large wild cat one day last week.

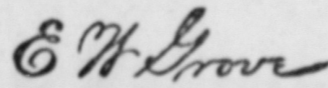
Prof. Gramley visited among the schools of this locality last week.
